IN OTHER WORDS

There are 31.1 grams in an ounce, or 480 grains, or 20 dwt Which means that there are 15.4324 grains in 1 gram

HOW THIS HELPS YOU

When you see a nugget on Ebay, that weighs 6.4 grains, and the bid is at \$13.25, you WANT to **be able to figure out how much per oz., you would be paying, its simple.** Take the price of the gold \$13.25 and divide it by the weight (in grains) = \$2.07 per grain Now multiply \$2.07 x 480 (grains in an ounce) = \$993.75 (per OZT)
