

November 10, 2012 Meeting of the NWMGP

The meeting was called to order by Dale Evans President

The minutes for the October meeting were read and accepted.

The treasurer's report for October was read and accepted.

Old business: The Hall rental was discussed and NVH has not given an invoice for the 1013 monthly meetings for Jan, Feb, Mar, April, Nov, and Dec. Sandy has emailed Cindy at NVH and informed her of our needs. It will cost 55.00 for the meeting hall for the year.

Reclamation work was done on the claim in October. Braxton planted trees in the reclaimed area from last year and also grass seed was spread.

Dale reports that good gold this year was found and more members participated in the outings and digs than the previous year. Dale also reports that the club, tentatively, will start on the ditch next year. Dale plans on clear cutting the area in the spring and will need help with this. There is still gold left in the area we were working in this summer so we may not get into the ditch area until later. We need to use the area we are already in then move to the ditch area. Braxton discussed the Christmas gold raffle. This gold is the clubs share from the outings. When the gold is split on Saturday and Sunday the club is given a split. These splits are then raffled off in December, to members only. The tickets are 1 dollar each or 6 for 5 dollars. There are 13 splits up for raffle. Support your club and buy some tickets.

The By-Law change ballots were counted. The By- Law changes, and the results of the voting were read by Vicki Walborn. All changes passed.

The election for officers was again discussed. Don Roe Jr. added his name to the SSgt of Arms list and Vicki Walborn added her name to the Treasurer spot. At this time the nominees are: Dale Evans for President, Braxton Walborn and Don Roe for Vice President, Deb Robinson and Vicki Walborn for Treasurer, Sandy Randall for Secretary, and for SSgt of Arms the club has Bill Moeller, Gary Wilmes, Ron Maupin, Bob Liston and Don Roe Jr. as candidates. Please send in those ballots if you can't attend the January meeting. Remember, this is your club.

The December Christmas party will be December 8th. The door will open at 11:00 and the pot luck starts at 12:00. Following the pot luck meal, the gold split raffle will be held, and then the gift exchange. Gifts were discussed. Please bring gifts that are not gender specific, remember all of us are prospectors. Gifts should be legitimate and not gag gifts. It is recommended that 15.00 be a cost figure however whatever a member is comfortable spending is OK. There have been some very nice homemade gifts given in the past.

Braxton discussed the Gold Show. April 27th and 28th and May 4th and 5th are dates that are being considered. Tickets are available now for the gold show raffle. At this time the tickets are generic and the club members are encouraged to take some packets and sell them. The prizes discussed are: gold detector, a Fellows print, a cotton wood bark carving, gold nugget, 50.00 bills, and silver. Vicki spoke to the vendors at the last gold show and got their input on how we can be a better gold show. Some of their suggestions are to increase the gate fee from 2 dollars to 3 dollars, have background music, get more vendors to attend and have a vendor drawing that would give the winning vendor free tables at the next gold show. Clarence suggested leaving the gate fee at 2.00. We want to have people come in and the more people that pass through the gate the more products will be sold. It was also suggested to continue to coordinate our show with the craft show that is in the spring also.

Clarence also suggested that the club saw out the east line of the claims next year to keep the line open.

Clarence also reported that some folks are getting started on their own claims with plans of operations and equipment set up. It is good to see this with all the regulations out there. Bill Moeller reported that Montanore hired some folks to do a bug study on Libby Creek. During a break in the meeting the club was given a summons to appear in small claims court concerning Harms claim that the NWMGP club owed him 2500.00. Braxton read the letter that Harm sent to the club on 9/26/12. The reason behind the removal of Harm from the club membership was discussed in length.

The November raffle was held. A special thank you goes out to everyone who donated items for the club raffle. This raffle helps to support the club and also allows the club to put on the club outings. And thanks to all who purchased tickets.
